
About Us


Support Group Meetings





This is the story of Mr Debdulal Chakraborty who is from Bankura, West Bengal. He was detected with lung cancer in January, 2019. First, when he was having symptoms like cough and breathlessness, fever, vomiting, pain in the right leg the doctors here thought maybe it was tuberculosis (TB). He went through all the tests for TB but everything came out to be negative. So, the local doctor suggested to go to a bigger facility. He went to the district hospital without any delay. A CT Scan was done for him in the Pulmonology Department. The reports devastated him as it showed a tumor in his right lung.


